On Property Rights

Property rights aren't a difficult concept to grasp. All it comes down to is, "Who had it *first*?" It's the very same question we ask children when they're fighting over a toy. Answering this question is usually not difficult, but sometimes the best we can do is to answer it relativistically, "Between those who are in conflict over the item, who had it *first*?" If a third party enters the conflict then it's simply a matter of determining among the three parties, "Who had it *first*?"
